Welcome new/returning members: Jennifer Frick, Kevin Hullquist, Gregory Lindholm Appointment of Gregory Lindholm to SVFPD Board. The Oath of Office was given to Gregory Lindholm by Administrative Officer Salucci. His term ends December, 2025.

Annual organizational meeting: Appointment of Board Officers. Larry Alexander was voted Board Chairman and Gregory Lindholm will serve as Vice Chair. Motion to approve officers: Williams/2nd Hullquist, three ayes including Frick; Alexander and Lindholm abstained. Motion Passed.

Administrative Officer Nancy Salucci

Hiring resiliency rep for public feasibility study Salucci was asked to research the possibility of obtaining an OES grant to fund a public feasibility study. She could not identify any OES grants for feasibility studies.

Investing District funds with California Class Salucci explained that this was something former Commissioner Scott Frick was looking into and would be worth pursuing. The director of California Class expressed interest in talking to us and perhaps setting up a meeting with other Siskiyou County Departments. Commissioner Jennifer Frick agreed to pursue this.

Review of SDRMA Property & Liability Insurance 2024-25 submission Salucci and Chief Buchter are working hard on reviewing and recalculating the exceedingly high values on our stations that were submitted to SDRMA last year. Chief Buchter explained the new valuations for buildings including slab and contents, and vehicles plus attached equipment.

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2024 CSDA/SDRMA Special Districts Leadership Academy approval. Salucci requested permission to attend this year's conference. She has been awarded a \$675 scholarship by CSDA to cover the conference fees. The Board agreed the department would be responsible for travel expenses to San Rafael.

Operations Reports: Notes submitted directly from Chief Paul Buchter

- Alliance (formerly "Consolidation") meeting Avery productive Alliance meeting was held on January 5th.
 - Standardized operations SOP's will be written that will be generic enough to include each department's specific strategies.
 - We are working on combining our recruitment efforts.
 - O The group has begun discussing combined trainings, that will involve all 3 departments plus Etna Ambulance. We discussed having trainings every week on Wednesday evenings, these will be comprised of one medical training per month, and three fire-centric trainings. These will meet the demand for more trainings and certifications. ISO requires four hours per week of training. California mandates that all volunteer members must be certified to a certain level (FF1, FF2). We are presently ahead on training levels. When our new training center is built, meetings will be held in Greenview.
 - Chief Hess will be running point as he is California certified by the State Fire Marshall as a structure fire instructor. Etna FD Chief Kramer and I will assist FJFD Chief Hess. I will teach the wildland fire component as I am certified.
 - Firefighters will be able to choose which trainings they want to attend, but must attend at least two per month
 - o I would also like to pay FJ Chief Hess, the same \$600/semester as we were paying Instructor Wilson, saying it would be a worthwhile investment. Board members agreed that when the training talks were finalized and I presented a proposal to them that they would consider paying Joseph.
- **2024 FEMA Grant for Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus:** The SCBAs have arrived and Assistant Chief Poling with pick them up tomorrow.
 - o Chief Hess will apply for a grant similar to 2023 grant that was partially funded (we got about half), with the hope of receiving funding for the rest of our SCBAs.

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- **Special District Fire Response Fund**. Look into Assembly Bill (AB570 23-24) to fund special districts to expand and increase fire suppression staffing. We need to keep an eye on this, as it will provide funding for full-time firefighters.
 - o Commissioner Lindholm will look into this.
- **Hiring firefighters for prevention projects.** We need to identify grants that meet our goals for the workforce.
- **Grants:** I would also like to look at grants and start prepping: CAL Fire-Volunteer Fire Capacity (closed) and Wildfire Prevention grants (open). FEMA-Assistance to Firefighters grant (AFG, opens soon), and the Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER, closed). CAL Water-Firefighter Grant Program. California Fire Foundation (closed). It would be great to have someone identified on the Board, who keeps track of the application dates, and prompts us (me) to stay on top of these.
 - o Commissioner Jennifer Frick offered to work with Chief Buchter on identifying and tracking grants.
